1947-2001

Shihan Fumio Toyoda was born in Japan on November 8, 1947 and began studying Aikido at the age of 10. After earning his shodan in Aikido at age 17, he was accepted as jyoju (live-in student) at the Ichikukai Dojo in Tokyo, where he committed himself to three years of rigorous training in misogi and zen. During this time he also pursued a law degree at Senshu University.

After graduating from Senshu University, Toyoda Shihan lived as uchideshi at Aikido World Headquarters (Aikikai Hombu Dojo), and there began his career as a professional, full-time Aikido instructor. His teaching responsibilities took him to South Korea and Hawaii, where he presented Aikido demonstrations and seminars to instructors and beginners alike.

Through these demonstrations and seminars, Toyoda Shihan recognized the growing need for full-time, qualified Aikido instruction and made a personal commitment to spread the art and philosophy of Aikido beyond the shores of his native Japan. Beginning in 1984, Toyoda Shihan began to fulfill this commitment by personally spreading the teachings of Aikido to Europe, Canada and more than 30 states across the U.S. In 1984, Toyoda Shihan founded the *Aikido Association of America* (AAA) to provide a network of support for dojo around the world in order to maintain standards of excellence in Aikido and the application of Aikido philosophy in daily life. Through his diligent work and commitment, Toyoda Shihan dedicated his life to promoting Aikido to its highest level throughout America, and internationally through Aikido Association International.

The Seminar

The **Aikido Association of America** is proud to sponsor the Southern Region Teaching Committee Seminar to be held at the Oberlin Road YWCA in Raleigh, North Carolina, October 1st-3rd, 2004. The training is open to students of any martial art or rank and from any organization or dojo. Instruction will be provided by Tajiri Sensei and Danieleley Sensei. The camp will feature quality instruction in both empty hand technique (throwing, pinning, and striking) as well as weapons technique with traditional bokken, staff, and tanto.

Hiroshi Tajiri Sensei began his Aikido training at the age of 17 at the Seibukan Budo Dojo in Kyoto, Japan. He moved to the United States in 1974 and began training under Shihan Fumio Toyoda, then the chief instructor of the Chicago Ki Aikido Society. He became Shihan Toyoda's Uchideshi (live-in student) and trained intensively in Aikido and Zen. Tajiri Sensei later moved to North Carolina and opened Seibukan Aikido Dojo and became a full time instructor. He teaches Aikido nationally and internationally for AAA/AAI, and is a member of the Teaching Committee. He also teaches self defense for law enforcement officers such as the North Carolina Highway Patrol, the NC Department of Corrections, and various police departments.

Ned Danieleley Sensei has been dojo-cho of Choshinkan Dojo since 1986. He started training in Aikido with the Aikido Association of America in 1980 and was a direct student of Shihan Fumio Toyoda for eight years. Ned holds the rank of Godan and is recognized as *Sensei* with the AAA. He also is a member of the Aikido Association International Teaching Committee. Along with his involvement in the formal martial arts he has taught several self-defense courses and has assisted in training police and military personnel in defensive tactics.
